All girls interested in golf, less than 12 years of age as at January 1, 2005, whether PC holders or beginners, may apply. From this pool of hopefuls, those identified with talent will graduate to the SLGA Under-12 Programme.

The SLGA Under-12 Programme has been designed specifically for PC holders and graduates from the SLGA Talent Search Programme. However, girls already holding a golf handicap are also most welcome to further their training in this programme. The main objective is to train the girls to play competitively, and by doing so improve their total skills package. Their training will be conducted by the NEXT Academy at Toa Payoh Golf Centre on Wednesdays at 5.30pm. All trainees will be supplied with free golf balls during training.
